
## Clean the flush valve



Loosen the cover screws.




Loosen 4 screws of the solenoid valve.



You can see a spring coil and a rubber diaphragm inside.



Take them out and wash them thoroughly clean.




Then put them back.

Note that the spring coil must be clamped onto the white retaining ring and inserted into the small round hole.

Otherwise, it will cause a flushing problem.



Retighten the screws of the solenoid valve in the correct direction.



Retighten the screws in the wrong direction will cause a flushing problem.



Retighten the cover screws.
